RAINING HOPE MINISTRIES COMPLIANCE RENEWAL

We have continued to praise the Lord for receiving the new operating permit in October of 2024! Last month, I sent out a separate update on our compliance requirements. On page 2 of this newsletter, I have listed the projects that need to be completed as of right now to have the license renewed.

This process began in June 2018, when the Ugandan government began shutting down illegal homes. All faith-based and non-governmental organizations operating within the city of Jinja, Uganda needed to re-register under new compliance changes.

The operating permit needs to be renewed yearly. We are still waiting for them to come for a follow-up inspection. They will then submit assessment reports which will be the basis for renewal of our license. We still need to raise the funds for the Community Service Hospital Project (page 2) and monthly doctor fee (\$164 a month) to fully complete all requirements.

We also have to **repair the shelter covering at the house** where we have all our events. There is termite damage to the wooden posts. We will need to replace them with steel rods. This will be something they will require us to fix because it is currently unsafe.

We still plan to celebrate this tremendous victory to thank YOU, our supporters and sponsors for helping to keep our home open! **All glory goes to God!**

RAINING HOPE MINISTRIES COMPLIANCE RENEWAL



COMMUNITY SUPPORT - HOSPITAL PROJECT - \$2,677

All homes that remain open are required to find ways to have more of a direct impact on the community . It is necessary to have a community-based project to show how Raining Hope is impacting our Ambercourt community. The proposed **HOSPITAL PROJECT** will affirm our impact in our community to

help the most vulnerable. We will take supplies to **Nalufenya Children's Hospital in Jinja** to help the hospital and patients. This time we will concentrate on the hygiene of the hospital and patients because it is effective and cheaper. We will have the ability to visit different wards and minister to families. Supplies for **patients include items such as laundry soap, regular soap, sugar, and milk.** They will also put together "mama kits" which are designed specifically for mothers who give birth. Much like how a **hospital chaplain** ministers to families, we will be able to spend time **visiting and praying** with patients. The hospital faces challenges that include shortages of personnel, equipment and medicines. What they currently are in need of are **hospital gloves, sanitizers, brushes and mops.**

This project is to be conducted **twice a year as an organized event.** Each project can change in terms of what is needed the most. This is also a **great opportunity to minister to more people in our community through the sharing of the gospel and meeting their physical needs.** The hospital management team will set aside a few hours for us to come and share with the hospital community.

The supplies for both the hospital, patients, and transportation of the supplies to the hospital is \$2,677. The first project needs to have a plan to start before the end of this year to satisfy our requirements for compliance for the renewal certificate..



REPAIRING THE SHELTER - \$1,305

The covered area where we have all of our events, including our services on Sunday, has become worn and damaged through the years of use. The area first consisted of tents. We then constructed a more sturdy shelter. But, the wooden posts have become infested

with termites. City engineers have looked at the structure and they are recommending to replace the wooden posts with aluminum or steel. As of right now, the structure is not safe and has been recommended not to use the area until we can replace the posts.


With the city officials coming to start the process of renewing our license, the posts will have to be replaced as soon as possible. We want to start the replacement before they arrive for the yearly inspection.

UPDATE ON PROMOTIONS

Tamarah and Joanne were not included in the above fees budget as we were waiting on enrollment lists to be reported. This past Tuesday, the enrollment list came out and both Tamarah & Joanne were qualified for University level. Tamarah was admitted to Makerere University Business School in Kampala. She was offered a Bachelor Course in Commerce. She has always dreamed of working in the banking sector. Joanne was also admitted to Victoria University Kampala. Joanne had applied for a course of a Bachelors of Science in Food Technology and Dietetics at Kyambogo University, but because she didn't perform well in Biology, she was instead admitted at Victoria University and offered a Bachelor course in Agriculture and Rural Innovation. The next step is they have to pick admission letters by the 31st of July after clearing 60% of the tuition and function fees. They have been given provision admission until they pay the tuition.

- 1. **SCHOOL FEES** The balance for the second term school fees of \$376 is currently due in order for the students to stay in school. We praise the Lord or the majority of the fees have been paid. Joanne & Tamarah qualified for University level! The total cost for both of them to start their courses is \$2,549.
