PRAYER FOR UGANDA

The rising fuel prices in Uganda have forced the prices of everything to increase. The people of the area of Kampala to Jinja began to **protest the skyrocketing commodity prices and general rising cost of living**. On July 25, 2022 they launched **three days of protests and riots**.

The Ugandans have argued that the government is not doing enough to address the high commodity prices and they began demonstrating as a last resort.

During the three day protests and riots, protestors burned tires to block major roads in order to prevent passage of vehicles. Rioters threw stones at passing motorists damaging cars and injuring people. Markets and stores were closed in fear of the rioters. Our younger children were kept home from school because of the threat of tear gas used in schools.

The protests are designed to cause the government to act. So many people are **"sleeping hungry".** Many people are beginning to starve because they can't afford food. Many Ugandans lost their jobs due to the COVID-19-induced lockdown and could not find another source of livelihood to take care of their families. (source: The Ugandan Monitor)

Godfrey expressed that **what is happening in the country right now is extreme.** He has been trying to prioritize the budget and cut back where he can.

Last month he went to buy food with what is budgeted, **yet every month the prices are higher so he buys less**. He said the utility companies (electricity and water) are raising the cost per unit without notice. They basically pay in advance for the month. So we think we have the month covered, but because the cost per unit is higher, water and electricity shut off without any warning once what they have paid in advance is used up.

Through this current economic crisis, Godfrey and I have been very aware that our Raining Hope family is loved and cared for by our faithful supporters and family. He said to me, **"we have been amply supplied."** We have food, shelter, medical care, water and electricity which is more than most. **They are cutting back but we are not lacking in anything.** They are trusting in the Lord in all ways. It is a challenge but they are extremely grateful their daily needs are met. **Throughout the pandemic we have experienced the miraculous and we still are.** Thank you for your sacrificial giving. **You are truly making a critical difference.**

RESETTLEMENT PROGRAM



We are beginning to enter an **exciting new phase of our ministry!** Over the past **fifteen years** we have helped countless students through their primary & secondary school education. Raining Hope has always been committed to helping these specific students realize their dreams by **sending them to University or trade school courses**. Our goal has been to help **launch them into their careers and help them to soar!**

Due to the government restrictions, after students graduate secondary school, they are required to leave. But we were given special permission

to keep all our students at the home while they are completing their post secondary school studies. We now have five students who have graduated and are ready to move on to the next step in their lives. Before we can have the final inspection for the new licensing of our home, we have to have these five students resettled and moved out on their own. The goal is to have them settled into their own places by the end of July 2022, before the official visit for final licensing approval. (Update: We have not had any funds come in for the resettlement. We have had to delay to the end of August 2022).

Godfrey has been in the process of preparing these five students. They will **still be actively involved with the home and with our ministry.** They just won't be living at the house. They have all expressed **how thankful they are to Raining Hope** and all the supporters for what you have done over the past fifteen years. They have all grown spiritually and desire to continue to grow and minister at Raining Hope. Godfrey said they consider Raining Hope their home and family. Godfrey said we will continue to play the role of a parent to these five and they can call on us in any capacity. They are ready to move out and move on.

This is with very mixed emotions. We are proud and excited but as their mum, it is emotional sending five of our students out at the same time. Godfrey as a father figure has the same set of mixed emotions. But this is what we have been working towards. It is time for them to leave the nest. **These are the five students who were are sending out to be a mighty influence for Him. The above photo is in this order left to right.**

Sylvia is working at a salon as a makeup artist. She is still waiting on the right opportunity to apply her journalism skills. She graduated with a degree in Journalism.

Joan is graduating this summer with her degree in Social Work. We will employ her as our required social worker.

Jesca is working at Miracle Herbal Clinic in Jinja Town. She graduated with a degree in Nursing. **Hillary** is not yet working but plans on setting up a business in Wanyange to sell cloth while he waits on a ministry opportunity for his seminary degree. He graduated with a degree from Bible Seminary. **Vivian** is working at the Sailing Club Restaurant in Jinja Town. She graduated with a degree in Hotel Management/Baking.

Sylvia and Hillary have leadership responsibilities at church on Sunday. They will continue with their ministry service at Raining Hope Ministries. Jesca, Vivian and Joan will remain active at Raining Hope as well.

Monthly Budget

- Since the start of the pandemic, our monthly budget in Uganda has increased to an average of \$2,200 a month. This covers food, medical, salaries, transportation, clothing and other miscellaneous items.
 For the month of August the budget needs are \$2370.
- In July, our budget increased to \$2,785 due in large part to an increase in our medical bill. June the medical bill was \$147. July it was \$743. This month the medical is \$356. We praise the Lord that we were still able to send the full budget at the beginning of the month due to your generosity.
- Additional needs for August:
 - Fumigation for the house: \$49
 - Plumbing Repairs: \$41
- Continue to pray as Godfrey is doing his best to live within the budget even though prices on everything are continuing to rise. The one area that can't be cut back is medical. He is trying to scale back and prioritize the food budget depending on the daily rising prices.
- We are thankful our family is taken care of. But they are especially concerned about their own immediate families who are struggling.
