Recently, the town of Jinja suffered the loss of four local pastors due to car accidents.

One accident involved three pastors from the same church in Jinja. They were on their way back from a burial when their car collided with a sugar cane truck that was abandoned on the road. The three pastors, Pastor Henry M., Pastor Rose L. And Paster Mande from ELIM Pentecostal Church all died instantly. There were three additional survivors of the accident. They were all admitted to the hospital but are now home.

Godfrey knew one of the pastors well. Pastor Henry M. helped us a lot when Sophia and Zuluta's mother passed away. The pastor helped with the twins who were left on their own after their mother died. One of the surviving passengers is Ketra who now takes care of the brother and sister of Sophia and Zuluta. They stayed with us while Ketra was in ICU in the hospital.

The second accident involved another pastor of Jinja just two weeks later. Pastor Ibrahim O. was knocked off the boda boda he was riding. Another car was driving towards them and he jumped off in a panic and fell into the middle of the road where he was run over by an oncoming car.

Please continue to pray for the community of Jinja at this time of loss.

HIGHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS - UNIVERSITY & TRADE SCHOOLS

Depending on the area of study, currently the **average for University or Trade School courses** is **approximately \$5,000 total for a three year program.** Due to your generosity, we have had eight students graduate from higher education.

EBOLA OUTBREAK

"On September 20, 2022, the health authorities in the Republic of Uganda declared an **outbreak of Ebola disease** caused by Sudan ebolavirus (SUDV), after a case was confirmed in a village in Madudu sub-county in Mubende district, central Uganda on September 19, 2022. As of October 26, a total of 115 confirmed and 21 probable cases, including 32 confirmed and 21 probable deaths (CFR among confirmed cases: 27.8%) have been reported. Overall, 15 cases with four deaths have been reported among healthcare workers." World Health Organization.

"Ebola is a severe, often fatal illness affecting humans and other primates. It has six different species, three of which (Bundibugyo, Sudan and Zaire) have previously caused large outbreaks. Case fatality rates of the Sudan virus have varied from 41% to 100% in past outbreaks. Early initiation of supportive treatment has been shown to significantly reduce deaths from Ebola."

"Uganda is no stranger to effective Ebola control. Thanks to its expertise, action has been taken to quickly detect the virus and we can bank on this knowledge to halt the spread of infections." World Health Organization Uganda

Godfrey said the village in the Mubende district is about a 5 hour drive from us. The virus has reach Kampala the capital city. They have been concerned that if it reached Kampala it could easily spread to the surrounding areas.

Please keep Uganda and our family in your prayers that the infections can be contained and kept under control. Because of this outbreak, Godfrey said they remain cautious. They will not have a New Year's Eve overnight gathering this year to avoid a large crowd gathered at the house.

Monthly Budget

Since the start of the pandemic, our monthly budget in Uganda has increased to an average of \$2,400 a month. This covers food, medical, salaries, transportation, clothing and other miscellaneous items. For the month of October the budget needs were \$2457. For the month of November the budget needs are \$2584.

Health

- Our budget for medical was higher this month due to illness. In October it was \$532. September it was \$296. Godfrey also reported that Almecca, the hospital we have used for years was sold and currently closed for renovations. We now use City Medical Care which will take time to build a good relationship with.
- To help keep the medical costs down, the current budget was increased to purchase more medicine that is kept at the home. Certain illnesses can be treated at the home to avoid the large bill from going to the hospital.
- Continue to pray as Godfrey is doing his best to live within the budget even though prices on everything are continuing to rise. The one area that can't be cut back is medical. He is trying to scale back and prioritize the food budget depending on the daily rising prices.
